

THE HISTORY OF HERITAGE WINDOWS



1600s

Leaded light windows were commonplace among the wealthy, a style still used in stained glass windows today.



1940 - 1950

The post-war period saw a housing construction boom, and developments in the aircraft industry made aluminium readily available and a viable alternative for window construction.



1700s

The Renaissance movement saw wrought iron casements and leaded glass windows gradually replaced by narrower windows.



1920 - 1940

Steel windows became a popular choice for industrial buildings, though they required heavy maintenance and were often draughty.






1770

Plate glass was introduced, allowing for larger glazed areas to be created.



1920

The Art Deco movement had far-reaching influence in architecture, fashion and art - including the introduction of colour in steel frames.



1850

Wrought iron production was considered too expensive, making way for steel windows designed to replicate the iron aesthetic.



1890

Saw growth in the Arts & Crafts movement, during which iron windows became popular again.

1990 - TODAY

Aluminium has become a popular alternative to traditional steel windows, replicating the heritage sightlines while providing better thermal performance. Powder coating technology means that modern aluminium frames are virtually maintenance-free and are a more affordable option for replacing ageing steel windows.



The authentic heritage 'putty line' sash features a classic 45 degree chamfer, designed to replicate the visual appearance of traditional period steel windows.





SQUARE


